Prayer and the Easter Affect

In the last chapter of Matthew, just twenty verses long, the world and all of history are changed for eternity. One huge event happens, and two consequences follow. The huge thing, the event that changes everything: Jesus is raised from the dead. The consequences: 1.The religious people who oppose Jesus bribe the soldiers to systematically spread lies about Jesus, and 2. Jesus sends his disciples right out into

such a world with this charge and promise: "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the Age!"

In what shape would you be today if Jesus had not died and risen and sent people, empowered by the Holy Spirit, to make a disciple out of you? Where would you be and what would your life be like if other disciples of Jesus had not preached Christ to you and prayed for you, with you? Would you have fallen for the lies others spread about Jesus?

You have probably had a conversation with someone at a time they needed to talk. Maybe they opened up and shared some concern or issue that was weighing heavily on their mind. Lots of times we say that we will be praying for them. What might happen if you offered to pray with them – right then and there? If you can cheer for your team at a sporting event, what's to keep you from praying with someone whose need is far more significant than the outcome of a game?

Indeed prayer is where mission starts. Before he gave his life for us, Jesus prayed for us (Luke 22:41-46; John 17).

The sure foundation of Jesus resurrection from the dead and his promise that he is with you and that his Father will answer your prayer (Matt 7.7-11)... these equip you and me for our mission to make disciples. And making disciples happens in three places: first in your home, then your neighborhood then in and through the congregation.

At the end of this month we will celebrate the empty tomb, Jesus' resurrection. To pray with someone in Jesus' name is to ask the Lord to have the "Easter effect" in the life of that person: to bring the death of whatever sin or evil is at work in their lives and the resurrection to new life in Christ. So, the next time you are in a conversation with someone and they are telling you about something serious going on in their life, go ahead, pray with them right then and there. Your heavenly Father will take it from there. He raised Jesus and changed history... he can handle your friend's need... and yours, too.

And when the children wanted to come to Jesus but the disciples held them back Jesus rebuked them. He explained that all people should come to him as the little children.

I see their love of God and their adherence to God's Word right there in their little faces. They love on me with God's love and that makes me pause. It makes me stop just long enough to think about how much I am loved by my God. So much that he puts me in a place with a daily reminder of that love.

I need to be more like them.

I need to call out the names of those around me and make them feel special. Why? Because they are. They are God's children and he commands me to love them like He does. So I wait and I look for opportunities to love them just as He loved me. I look for opportunities to call out their name like a little preschooler and to shower God's love all over them.

See.....I really do have a great job...with a great Boss. He loves me and greater than that, He loves you too. Hear that message as we march on to His resurrection this Easter.

During worship, we will process into the building area of the current fellowship hall and literally write these names on the framework that will support in the actual walls of the church. There will be plenty of sharpies to go around!

We are truly building prayers into our church. Your words will be there as long as the building stands. Pretty powerful stuff, my friends.

BUILDING COMMISSION UPDATE

Have you noticed a change at St. Paul Lutheran Church??? After a couple of delays, we are seeing progress...

January and February:

- Renovation of the chapel began on January 4th.
- The chapel, most closets, storage, and the shed were all cleaned out and organized...resulting in a sale bringing in approximately \$2750 to go toward the project.
- Excess water was drained, a sump pump was installed under the chapel, and the foundation should be repaired by the time you receive this Epistle.
- Other repairs of the chapel include reworking of electrical, windows, and flooring.
- Bathrooms and stairs renovation begin to bring the chapel up to code and meet ADA standards.
- The playground was moved and updated to meet state requirements and ADA standards.

Some things to expect in March and April:

- The chapel roof will be repaired.
- Flooring, bathrooms, and cabinets/sinks will be installed in the chapel.
- Work will begin in the courtyard.
- The offices will be temporarily moved to the chapel (probably after Easter).
- Work should begin in the main building after Easter.

If you have questions or concerns, please contact any member of the Building Commission and/or come by the Fellowship Hall between services. Look for details from the Capital Campaign Committee of an informational gathering, an opportunity to add a prayer to the "Prayer Wall", and possibly a "Hard Hat Tour" – all tentatively planned for late March.

We may not know the final total fund raising efforts for a while as the tabulation/accounting completes, but the benefactors of this event are several and pleased to receive the generosity of all those whom participated!



On March 13th, we will be accepting the latest Class of New Disciples into our Congregation. Please make it a point to attend services that Sunday and welcome this huge class of New Members to St. Paul. Carolyn Zunker has organized this group and their training. Thank you, Carolyn for your support. This is a result from the Friendly Visitors, Board of Evangelism, and the Board of Christian Education. Thank you all who are in conjunction with this process!

As we all can see, the St. Paul Lutheran Church Master Plan, Phase One continues in full force. On the Guenther Street property, the Preschool Playground is finished with new equipment and fencing and walkways for a secure place that our children to muster for fun! The Chapel is nearing finish of its repairs and preparation for the Administration Offices temporary relocation. The drainage issue for the Courtyard will be under construction this month. We will observe Palm Sunday on March 20th with observance of the Last Supper: Maundy Thursday Services at noon in St. Martin's Church and evening service in our Sanctuary. If you have not been to our Easter Sunrise Service at 6:30, it is awe inspiring and worth the early alarm. This takes place in our Courtyard, construction permitting and if weather does not, we will muster in the Sanctuary. Emily Harborth, Director of the Board of Congregational Life, and her team of volunteers will be providing breakfast!

No one knows for certain where the term *EASTER* came from, but one theory is that it's derived from the Anglo-Saxon goddess Eostre, who was connected with fertility and spring. Easter is also often known as Pasch, which comes from the Hebrew Pesach, meaning 'Passover'. In addition, the Easter bunny has pagan origins and has no real connection with the Christian celebration, other than the use of eggs as a metaphor for the new life Christians receive because of the Resurrection. Bar none, Easter is the single most important holy day of the Christian Church including St. Paul! Join this Season!!

March 13th is the beginning of 'Daylight Savings Time'. Be sure to set your clocks, watches, phones, computers and all, so that you arrive on Campus at the correct time for services and Sunday School!!

Why Plant Churches? Making NEW Disciples

Last month we took a look at the biblical mandate for planting new churches and recognized church planting as being faithful to the Great Commission and modeled after the first century church multiplication that we read about in the New Testament. This month I'd like to propose that we should plant new churches because new churches are more effective at making new disciples.

"More churches mean more disciples." This is a church multiplication saying that is often attributed to the Baptists. Timothy Keller puts it this way: "New churches best reach new generations, new residents, and new people groups." Studies have repeatedly demonstrated how younger generations, people new to a community, and different socio-economic or ethnic groups are reluctant to join established organizations or groups. And this is not a new phenomenon nor does it only impact the church. I personally witnessed this in North Dakota with local Senior Citizen Clubs. In town after town on the prairie, these clubs have folded in the past decade after a 30 or 40 year run. Why? Not because there are no longer any senior citizens! It's just that today's seniors don't identify with those established clubs of an older generation. We see the same thing in churches, too. New churches break down barriers of participation for new people to come and be a part of a community of faith.

Yet even more important than this is the fact that the new people coming to new churches in large part come from an unchurched background. Approximately 8 out of 10 new adult members of established congregations join by membership transfer from another congregation. Conversely, in new churches, the numbers are nearly reversed: approximately 7 out of 10 new adult members were previously unchurched. Church planting is so effective at reaching the unchurched, Ralph Moore reports, that one denomination discovered that 80% of new believers across their denomination came to Christ through the ministry of new churches less than two years old!

There is no doubt about it, church multiplication is essential to reaching the unchurched and making new disciples. Establishing new churches is the evangelical frontier for our association of congregations to be faithful to the Great Commission, to "Go and make disciples of all nations," reaching new people for Jesus.




