

A witness with words... Part 1

Christ says we are his witnesses. Witnesses open their mouths and tell what they have seen or believe... they speak with their actions as well. As Christ's witnesses, my calling and yours is to point others to Him and not to ourselves nor to our religion.

To Christ's witnesses who lived in a time and place that was hostile to their faith, a fellow named Peter gave this instruction: "honor Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared

to give the reason (to make a defense) to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and respect..." (I Peter 3.15)



Our beginning – As witnesses, the story we have to tell begins just like it did for the first man and woman in Genesis 3. Whatever we say about our faith, it must begin with the humble confession that just like Adam and Eve, even though God created us in his perfect image, we are not perfect; we are sinners who have tried to hide from God, tried to cover our rears, and even tried to be our own gods. We are the good, the bad, and the ugly all in one. We all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God (Romans 3.23). For us, there is no sin greater than another and no sin that God cannot forgive; there is no life that God cannot redeem, no heart God cannot change. Again, our witness to Christ has a humble, humble beginning. The first words of our witness are: "I am sinner; created and loved by God yet not deserving of his mercy."

Our life history – There is a way that the Holy Spirit has made a believer out of you: he sent someone to tell you about Jesus... chances are it's been many people who have preached Jesus to you in such a way that he has taken hold of you and created faith for you. Who are the "delivery boys & girls" that the Holy Spirit has used to carry the message of Jesus Christ to you? There have probably also been "ups and downs" in your life, mountain tops and valleys... even if you are like me, a stable, long-time Lutheran. There are times when your life feels more like Good Friday and times that feel more like Easter... and times when it feels like you are stuck between death and resurrection. There are days when you seem to be riding the crest of a wave, and days and long nights when you seem stuck in the trough. In his classic, The Screwtape Letters, C.S. Lewis reminds us that the Lord uses the troughs more than the crests to form our faith. This rhythm of cross and resurrection is the rhythm of the life of a witness to Christ. Being well aware of this rhythm and ready to name it goes a long way to preparing you to put it into words... to witness to Jesus.

Next month, I'll write more to help you – and myself – be prepared to be witnesses who in simple words can give the reason for our hope. For now, take a few moments and consider, and even practice, your response to these three questions: 1. How and when did my life as a disciple of Jesus begin? 2. How did it continue? (or did it?) 3. How has He changed me and why?

Pray for those who are in those positions that God will look down upon them and guide them for fairness and completeness in their duties. 




We, like ants, are creatures of little strength, but our Lord and Savior is mighty! It's the middle of summer, it's hot and humid, but we march forward together doing God's work.




# Love for the Least

#### **Building Commission**

The Building Commission recently asked our General Contractors – Friesenhahn Construction – about their experience so far working the Expansion and Renovation Project here at St. Paul.

#### Here's what they told us:

#### Johnny Friesenhahn

# How do you see God working in your life during this project?

God is always in my life. He provides me with the strength to face each day with a positive attitude. As far as His involvement as related to this project, again, He helps me to have a positive daily attitude. Some days, additional graces may be needed to deal with the various problems that arise because of the remodeling unknowns that become exposed during construction. I believe He inspires me and others to come up with solutions to these problems.

#### What has been the most difficult part?

The most difficult part has been, and continues to be, the changing of the roof from the one specified to a standing seam roof, and the problems that have been uncovered during the demolition; and, coming up with the most cost effective solution during the reconstruction phase to address these problems.

#### What has been the most rewarding part?

I believe the most rewarding portion of the project has been working with the people of St. Paul Lutheran Church. They have been very positive about encouraging us to keep up the good work, that our firm had been selected to do this project; and, coming up with solutions for problems discovered during construction. 
