Strategic planning for ministry is essential in the ministry of the church.

This is the task that lays, before us as a congregation.

It is also the task that, if ignored, can be the death of any congregation. Stagnation will lead to complacency. Complacency will never be a component of growth in the kingdom of God.

Look to the future and look for ways to engage ministry like you have never done it before. This will bring life to our congregation but more importantly it will bring light to a dark world.

#### **His Witnesses**

After his resurrection, Jesus commissions us with this promise: "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth." Acts 1.8.

Since Jesus has defined you and me as **his witnesses**, it's probably important and helpful for us to consider the first witnesses to his resurrection:



"Now on the first day of the week Mary Magdalene came to the tomb early, while it was still dark, and saw that the stone had been taken away from the tomb. <sup>2</sup> So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him." John 20.1-2

His first three witnesses are a woman and two men... confused followers who even though they run about quickly are yet slow to believe Jesus.

Each of them is a mixed bag of quick and slow, faithful and doubting, saint and sinner. Peter had his bacon saved by Jesus grabbing him by his own hand when he was sinking... and yet on that night of Jesus' arrest, Peter denied ever knowing him. The "other disciple" was beloved by Jesus, he was present at the last supper, present at the crucifixion, and now present at the empty tomb, he is even the author of the Gospel of John... yet he confesses how slow he was to understand and believe. And Mary Magdalene: she had been right with the other women at his crucifixion, near enough to the cross to smell his blood and sweat and hear his breathing. She, too, had heard his promise to rise again... but she is sure it's not true. "Someone has snatched his body" she says twice (John 20.2,13).

His first witnesses are **slow to believe**, but by the time Jesus is done with them he will have direct, intimate conversation with each of them – he will even call Mary by name – and they will be his witnesses... to the end of the earth. If you believe as I do that Jesus tells the truth and does not lie, then how about that:

- Slow believers like you and me are his witnesses
- Plenty of our neighbors are slow to believe as well... and Jesus sends you and me to them as **his witnesses**.

Your life, your experiences, your actions, your relationships, and your words all compose your **witness to Jesus.** One more thing: the risen Jesus did not allow Mary to stay there and hold onto him (John 20.17). Instead, he sent her out to tell others.

His witnesses... out we go.

#### Gilead's Hope Cambodia

2016 Year-End Report

Dear Friends,

Thank you for your generous contributions in 2016 which allowed us to help many poor Cambodian patients. Our major expenses continue to be open-heart surgeries for rheumatic heart disease, requiring valve replacement or repair at a cost of \$3,500 for one valve, and \$4,500 for two valves. Seven patients received life with this operation and are eternally grateful to all of you. There are still hundreds of young people in Cambodia with rheumatic heart disease. Most cannot afford the operation, and so they die. The more funds we receive, the more patients can undergo this life saving cardiac surgery.

We treated more than 60 other patients with diverse diseases including lupus nephritis, myasthenia gravis (MG), kidney stones, cervical spine stabilization, nephrotic syndrome, and aplastic anemia. The cost is less than \$1,000 each. These patients had no hope for medications or a procedure without your contributions. I wish you could be present as they receive treatment and improve, constantly thanking me for your funds giving them life.


