Then Peter came up and said to him, "Lord, how often will my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? As many as seven times?" ²² Jesus said to him, "I do not say to you seven times, but seventy times seven. Matt 18.21-22

"Adam" came from a family of Brothers. All throughout their growing up years, mom and dad had made sure they all sat in the pew together every week, sat down at the dinner table together most every night, and prayed and played and worked hard together. The boys hunted together, wrestled, played, fought, got in trouble, competed with and against each other, went to school and learned. Eventually they all married and went about in different towns and states living out their vocation.

Almost 20 years into his marriage, Adam learned something from his wife about his brother. She confessed that the competition between brothers had extended to the bedroom: she had committed adultery with his brother while she herself was engaged to Adam. By the grace of God, Adam listened to his wife calmly... he also restrained himself from throttling his brother. There was plenty of score for Adam to keep; righteous anger was ready to go in his transmission, just waiting for him to put it in gear and step on the gas. But as Adam allowed **time** between this stimulus and his response; as he prayed, and talked with his wife and with his pastor... it took about a year and a half... but he realized that keeping this score would destroy generations of his family. So, by the grace God, he has swallowed his pride, forgave both his wife and his brother... and let go of the score. The old score still creeps into Adam's conscience now and then; that's why he stays close to Jesus... so that he can hear every week how great the debt the Lord has forgiven him.

In the most dangerous petition of the Lord's Prayer, we pray, "And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us."


What does this mean?

We pray in this petition that our heavenly Father would not hold our sins against us and deny our prayers because of them. We know we have not earned, nor do we deserve, those things for which we pray. But we ask that he would grant us all things through grace, even though we sin every day and deserve nothing but punishment. And so we, too, will heartily forgive, and gladly do good to those who sin against us. (from The Small Catechism)

Dearly beloved, sin has happened among you. You are not called to enable it, nor to keep its score; do either one and you imprison yourself and your family... and even our congregation. How great the debt Jesus has forgiven you!? Time for you to do likewise.

Thanks to all the volunteers who made it easy to do. God has blessed me with a loving family in St. Paul.






