October's vocabulary word: Dead

Vocabulary matters a great deal. In his classic "The Screwtape Letters," C.S. Lewis identified how Satan works with subtle, deadly skill to get us to spin our vocabulary in his favor... without us even knowing it. Pastor Tony Stoutenberg (LCMC, Hayward, WI) gives a poignant example of this:

Since the second century, there has been a heresy called Gnosticism. Gnostics are allergic to notions of sin, evil and death. Because of this, one modern gnostic, Mary Baker Eddy, encouraged her followers not to speak of dying, but of "passing away." The term has slipped into the American vernacular, unfortunately, even among Christians. Essayist Brian Jay Stanley writes,

"It is the perfect [phrase] for the skeptical yet sentimental modern mind, which cannot accept annihilation, nor easily believe in immortality. "Passed away" allows vague hope without dogma, as if to say, 'He has gone somewhere else, please don't ask for details."


Paul and John tell us that "this world" and "the darkness" are "passing away," (1 Corinthians 7:31 and John 2:17; 1 John 2:8) but not people. According to the Bible, people die; after they die, they are dead. That is not a cause for fear, but it is an important distinction. In Gnosticism, this world is some sort of illusion that our true self must pass through and escape. Christians confess that this fallen world is redeemed by Christ, and the dead will be raised.

In light of this promise of resurrection, the New Testament uses the word "sleep" as a way of speaking of death (I Corinthians 15 and I Thessalonians 4). Just as we are awakened from sleep day by day, on the Last Day all who are in Christ shall be raised from the dead to eternal life. That is not some vague hope; it is the promise of God in Christ Jesus.

You and I are not Gnostics, we're Christians. This world is not a place for you to escape from; it is precisely where Jesus has put you in order to follow him and let his light shine for your neighbor. And don't worry: when you die you won't just pass vaguely "away" to somewhere else. You will be dead... and Jesus will raise you to be with him for eternity. Thanks be to God.
