A Witness with Words, Part II

How and when did your life in Christ begin? For me it began in my baptism, on March 25, 1962 at St. Mark's Lutheran Church in Barrington, Rhode Island. My Dad and Mom had the Lord declare his promise over me when I was a three-monthold sinner, squirming in my diaper... a cloth one. Their friends from the congregation, Floyd and Fran Drieth, promised as my godparents to support my parents in raising me as a Christian and promised to hold my Dad and Mom accountable to their promise to the Lord. Thankfully, my parents did a great job raising this forgiv-



en sinner in the faith, teaching us the Bible and praying with us, taking us to church with them and walking the walk ... so the Drieths had it easy. How and when did **your** life in Christ begin? It may be quite different from mine. Take a minute right now and write down just a sentence or two... this will help you be prepared to be what you are, namely, Christ's witness.

Since that beginning, what have you learned about God, about others, and about yourself? For myself, I have learned time and time again that God is true and real. He says and does what NO ONE ELSE would. I have learned that other people are my neighbors and Jesus sends me to them. I have learned that I am a big sinner and that Jesus' love for me is far bigger than my sin. And I am just learning anew how to love people by investing time in them. How about you?... what have you learned about God, others, and yourself? Take another minute and write down a sentence or two. Send what you have written to me via text or e-mail or letter and I'll buy you a cup of coffee or a beer; really.

Jesus is very, very clear. Fresh from tomb that first Easter he says to us: "Thus it is written, that the Christ should suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, ⁴⁷ and that repentance and forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. ⁴⁸ You are witnesses of these things." Luke 24.46-48 And in case you still thought he was talking to someone else when he said "you," he said again in Acts: "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth." Acts 1.8 ... and then eight more times in the New Testament... that's enough times that even shy Lutherans ought to be encouraged and ready to show and tell the love and truth of Jesus

God's purpose for you and me is to be **his witnesses**... to be his hands and feet, his ambassadors to carry out the ministry of reconciliation (II Corinthians 5.16-21). Jesus did not wait for us to come to him, he came to us... and he sends us to our neighbor. So again, take just a minute to review your answers to the two questions above; this – and the promise of the Holy Spirit© - will help you be a faithful, humble witness to Jesus. Every day you wake up you take the witness stand for Jesus Christ... so help you God. He will.

Faith requires us to nurture it through study. Faith requires daily conversations with the one in whom we believe. If we are failing to do any of these then we are failing to be faithful.

1 Timothy 4:15 "Take pains with these things; be absorbed in them, so that your progress will be evident to all."

A new school year seems to bring that into focus. Just as there is excitement for a new school year there can be excitement for a fresh look at our faith. There are great opportunities for each of us to renew our commitment to the process of faith. To be involved in study. To worship together. To grow together. It is time to be absorbed in them. It is time to take our faith seriously. Take advantage of the opportunities to grow in faith.

LCMC Annual Convention



The LCMC Annual Convention was very inspiring and informative. There were 12 attendees from our church so we were very well represented! They were Fred Terry, Rodger and Barbara Johnson, Caleb Bahr, John Magness, Arlen and Jo Pietsch + Tyler and Colton, Chuck Knudson, Judy Henfey, Emily Harborth.

Friday evening the opening worship service was led by Pastor Paul Fiske of Christ Lutheran Church in Waco.

Saturday morning began with the business meeting and council elections. Ray Vaughn spoke throughout the convention. Pastor Bryce Formwalt gave a mission report. There are 3 key revisions they want to implement:

- 1. Go from a District-centered (statewide) approach to a Congregational-centered (local) approach.
- Go from a District-funded and managed process to a District-resourced/Locally funded and managed process.
- 3. Go from planting Lutheran-looking churches for Lutherans that live in a different area to planting different-looking churches to evangelize the lost that are unreached by established congregations.

The convention was concluded with worship/communion/blessing of the council.

On a personal note, the convention was a blessing to me because of the theme: "How Beautiful are the feet of those who bring Good News." Romans 10:15

My father, was a Lutheran pastor and when he was dying from cancer in the hospital, the nurses would rub his feet for relief of the edema. They commented that he has beautiful feet! And he did-both physically and from sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ.






