



Where are we going? – Part III of III

Whether you are looking at a map or following Jesus, it helps to know where you are headed... otherwise we might miss the mark, go nowhere, or go in the wrong direction☺. So this summer, I have used this space in our newsletter to address three questions with you: Where have we been? Where are we now? (see July and August: <http://www.nbstpaul.org/resources/newsletter/>)... and this month:

Where are we going? Jesus sets the course for our congregation when he says “Go, make disciples of all nations...” Thanks be to God, he does not allow us as a congregation to stay put and get lazy. He provides for our growth, both spiritually and numerically. In terms of the chart I gave you last month, we would be neglecting our mission if we were to stay in the “change phase” or even the “making disciples in the parish/congregation” phase. Where the Lord calls us is to make disciples of **ALL NATIONS... that’s what a fruit-bearing tree does☺**.



This means we are called to baptize more persons – especially adults. This means that you and I need to become more effective at engaging people outside our walls... respectfully engaging our unbelieving neighbors with the truth and love of Jesus Christ as Lord alone.

I’ve read a lot and spoken with several senior pastors of large congregations, and with Mark Vander Tuig, our LCMC Service coordinator. The evidence and their testimony agree: In order for us to effectively grow past the “400+ per week” barrier, we as a congregation need to:

- 1) make sure our worship services, education and small groups are top quality, life-changing
- 2) shift decision-making power to a smaller number of people and reduce our bureaucracy
- 3) become more formal and deliberate in our assimilation of new persons; help people connect quickly and deeply with Jesus AND with his people through participation in a small group.


To do this we need to greatly increase our number of small groups that meet both on and OFF CAMPUS for fellowship, study, prayer and service (engaging our “head, heart, and hands”). As senior pastor in order to promote rather than inhibit our growth, I need to focus on preaching, vision keeping and vision casting, and identifying problems before they become disasters. To that end and with the council’s blessing, I begin a course of study this month to improve my effectiveness: a doctorate of ministry program which will allow me to stay here in New Braunfels... and which will work like fertilizer... so that together we may bear the fruit God intends for us: making disciples of all nations, baptizing and teaching all that our Lord has commanded us. I am deeply grateful for your prayers and partnership in our mission.

LCMC Texas District Gathering Report

July 28-29, 2017

Kay Magness, Glenn Wellbrock and John Magness attended the Gathering as your delegates. What an inspiring time it was! In the closing worship service, we even experienced following the liturgy from the “red” worship book.

The theme this year was “MULTIPLY” (“... I am sending you to them... “[Acts 26:17]). The speakers were there to tell us how they have been successful in “multiplying churches”. It is all built around relationships and lots of dedication (or hard work) for God’s kingdom on earth.


Oscar Benavides, Executive Director of LINC North Texas delivered a very impressive presentation. “LINC-NT serves in public schools, apartments, homes, churches, and restaurants to meet needs that bring people closer to Jesus ... through a combination of church planting and community development” A for instance was that while Jesus and the Bible are not “allowed” in public schools, LINC, in a volunteer status, can and does teach Biblical principles, usually after school combined with tutoring.

Pastor Pete Mueller, lead pastor of ACTS Lakeway (LCMS) and Executive director of Acts Church Network told that he was called to leave a large, comfortable setting in a St. Louis LCMS church to help a struggling church plant in Austin: thus ACTS Lakeway. He also asked Pastor Peter Horn who is pastoring a struggling church plant in Austin to share some insight. Pastor Peter related how it is difficult to remember God is in charge and His time does not always coincide with human time. He also reminded us that it is important for others to financially support church planting efforts while they “get on their feet” and start more church plants.

There were many and varied “breakout sessions” on a myriad of topics including our own Chuck and Azeneth Knudson telling about “Mission San Antonio”. It was a great way to get charged to help further the God’s kingdom. In the business session, our Judy Henfey was reelected to serve on the LCMC Texas District Council. Contact Judy to find out how you can help with the District’s mission efforts and church planting and church revitalization.

A closing remark: While I love my generation, we need the next (and the next) generation to begin attending these gatherings to get ideas, to fellowship and to get pumped up for the service of our God spreading the good news of Jesus to those who are waiting to hear it from you and me. Thank you for letting us be your delegates.


